Pray: Do you know anyone that doesn't love Jesus? Why not pray together as a family that that person will come to know Jesus and that Jesus will change their heart.

Key Phrase: The love of God changes people

Today's story: Discuss what you can remember about the life of Paul. Talk about how his heart changed when he came to know God.

Key Phrase: I'm special because God created me

Today's story: Today we looked at the creation story and how we became because God created us. Together list some of the things that each of you. Maybe write or draw them. Then thank God for all he has made special about each of you.

Key Phrase: God has a plan

Today's story: Even though Adam and Eve didn't do what God wanted, God still had a plan on how to help people be his friends forever. Who did he send into the world to come and help us know God better?

Pray: Ask God that he will help you follow his plan so that you can know him as your best friend forever.

Genesis 6 – Noah

Key Phrase: God is the promise keeper

Today's story: Can you think of any promises you have heard people say? What is a promise? When God makes promises he always keeps his promises. God put a rainbow in the sky to remind Noah of his promise to him. The bible tells us lots about God's promises. God promises that you will never be on your own.

Pray: Together now thank God that he promises to be with you forever.

Genesis 12 – Abraham

Key Phrase: God is the promise keeper

Today's story: Abraham learned to trust God. Can you remember any bits of the story where he trusted God? Why do you think we should trust God?

Pray: Why not say together, "I can trust God because" (You could even write them down or draw them together and repeat every day.)

Genesis 25 - Jacob and Esau

Key Phrase: God is always with us

Today's story: Jacob and Esau sometimes weren't kind to each other and just before the end of the story they became friends again. Even when they were angry at each other, God was still with them and was helping them.

Pray: Can you think of anything that you want to pray about that you need God's help with? Ask God to help make things better and for you to know he is always with you.

Genesis 37 – 42 – Joseph

Key Phrase: God is always with us

Today's story: Think of all the weirdest places anywhere and say them aloud – do you think God is with you in those places? YES he is. No wall is too high for God to climb – he is with us all the time.

Pray: Ask God to help you know that he is with you every day in everything and to remember to talk to him wherever you are.

Exodus 1 – A Baby in the River

Key Phrase: God keeps us safe

Today's story: God kept Moses safe even as a little baby. God keeps us safe too. Remind the children God will look after them.

Pray: Thank God that he looks after us and pray for the week ahead. Maybe draw things that you will be doing this week and ask and thank God for keeping you safe.

Exodus 2 – Moses and the Burning Bush

Key Phrase: God always has a plan

Today's story: It took a long time for Moses to be brave and follow God's plan for his life. God has a plan for your life. If you want why not build an obstacle course at home or in the park and have some races. Make the link to keep going even when it's hard. That's what God wants us to do – is to keep going, even when it's hard.

Pray: Ask God to help us all keep going even when it's hard.

Exodus 12-13 – Moses and the Red Sea

Key Phrase: God keeps his promises

Today's story: The Israelites had to wait a very long time for God's promises. They had to keep trusting God had a plan. Sometimes it feels like our prayers are tortoise prayers that take a long time to answer, sometimes our prayers are like cheetah prayers and are answered quickly and sometimes there is a different answer. But what God asks us to do is to trust him to keep his promises.

Pray: Pray together now for something that you have been thinking about – remember God keeps his promises.

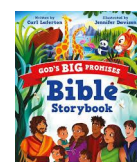

Key Phrase: God helps us

Ask: What are you looking forward to most about heaven?

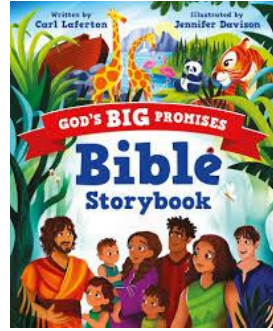
Pray: Ask God to help you to follow Jesus in all circumstances and that you will know the joy that Jesus brings.
