How did Joseph persevere?

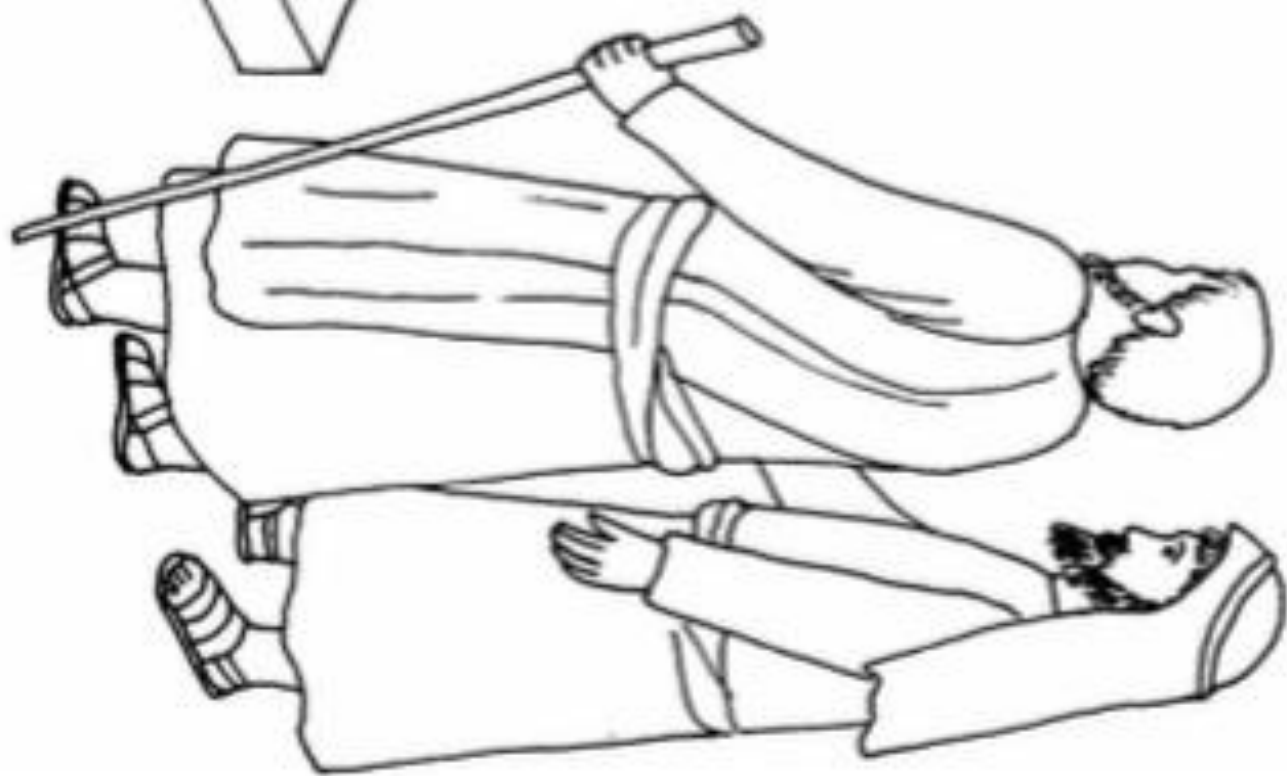
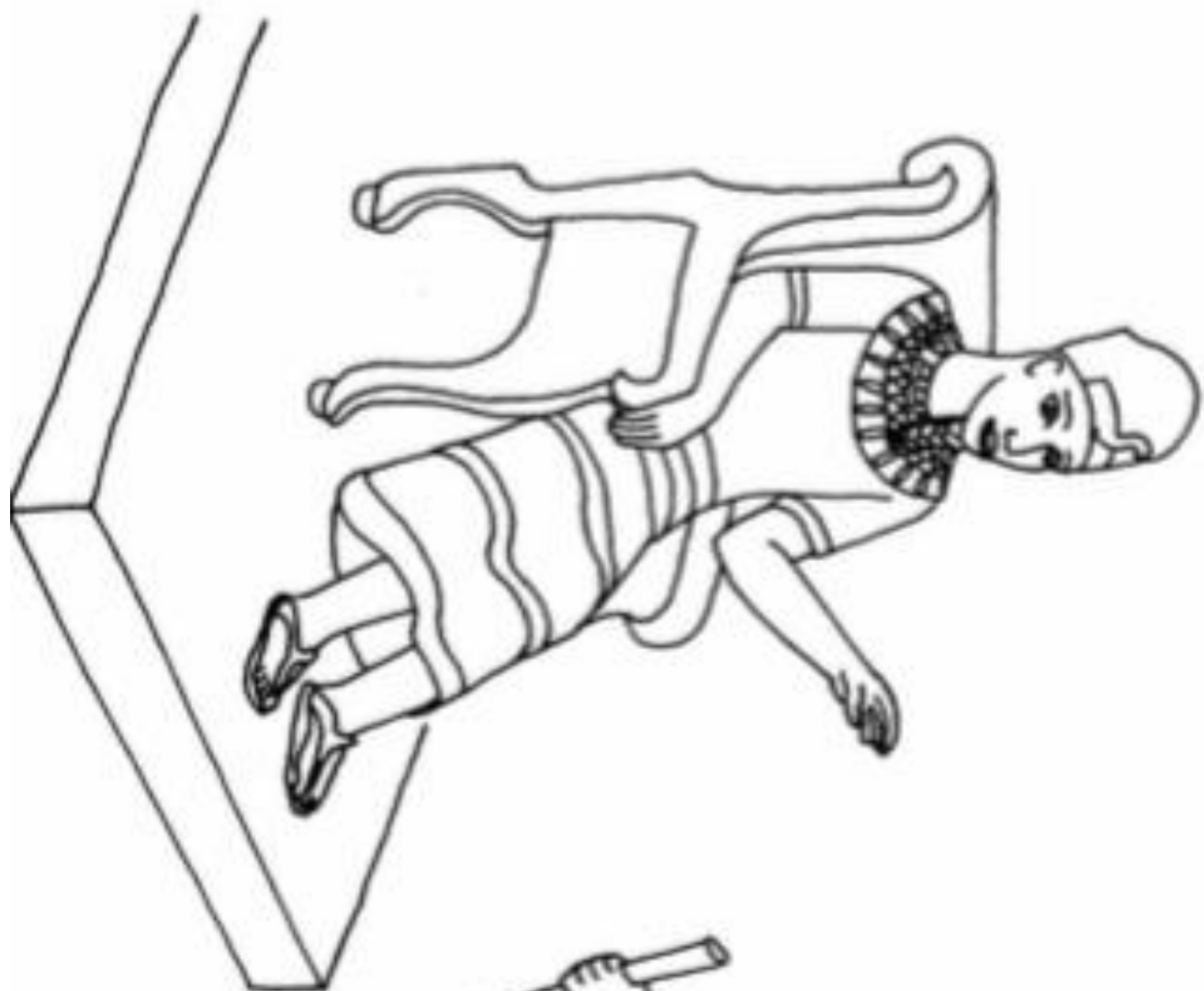
How did Moses' Mum persevere?

If you would like to, you can draw a picture of where you would like God to help you persevere.

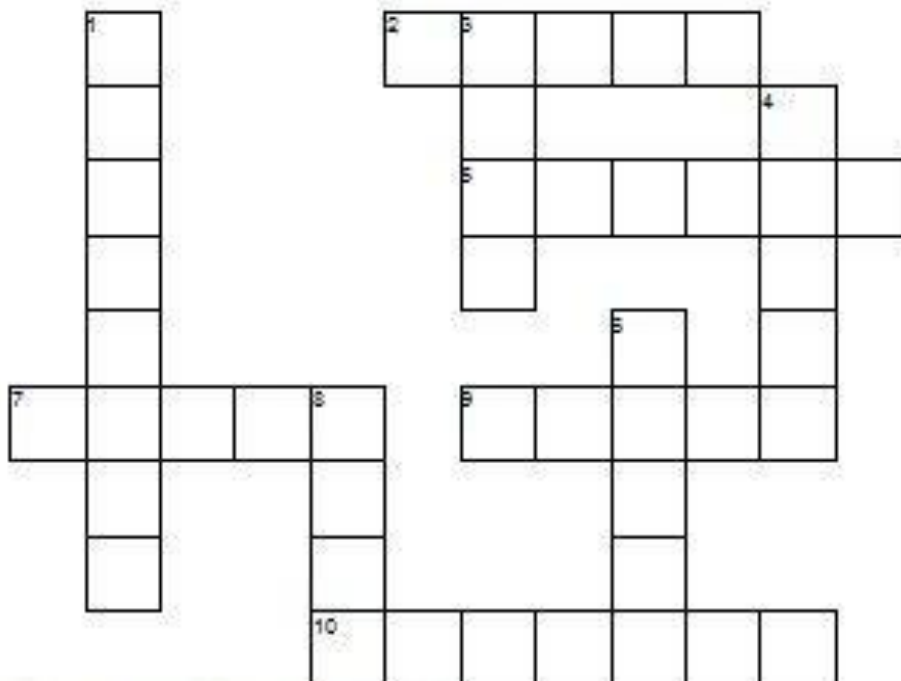


Colouring sheet – If you have a printer here is a colouring sheet you can print off and colour in.
